Glenda accepted Christ at an early age and united with the Mt. Zion Missionary Baptist Church in Watertown, TN where she served as a pianist for many years. She graduated from Wilson County Training High School with the Class of 1957. Glenda also attended Tennessee A & I State University majoring in music and business.
