

Pamela Denise Norton Dozier was born in Buffalo, NY, November 15, 1963. She was born to the Late Elder Wilson David Norton and Mary Lorenza Johnson Norton Boyd. She was educated in the Nashville school system and graduated from Whites Creek High School. Continuing her education, she received a Bachelors' of Science in Psychology from Middle Tennessee State University in Murfreesboro, TN.

She received Christ as her personal savior at an early age at Pentecostal Tabernacle COGIC (COP) on 1201 Clay Street under the pastorate of Dr. Johnathon Greer. Pam was married on April 21, 1990 to Kenneth Dozier by Elder Gaither H. Brooks at Belmont Church on Music Row. Although later divorced, upon this union were born two children; an infant daughter, Naomi (deceased) in 1992 and son, Lemuel Armond Dozier born in 1994.
