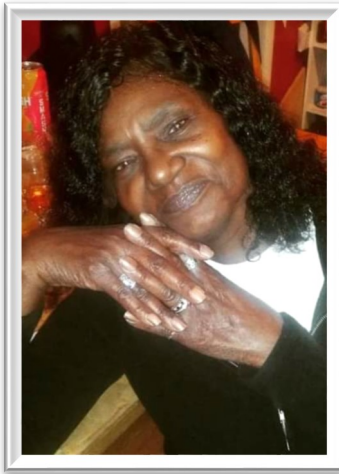

# REFLECTIONS

## Esther Louise "Hettie" Doss

March 8, 1954 - March 13, 2021



On March 8, 1954, Esther Louise (Hettie) Doss was born in Lebanon, Tennessee, Wilson County, to John and Ella Shannon, (who preceded her in death). Hettie was the third oldest of eight children and the second oldest daughter of six girls and the first daughter that God called home.

Hettie began her early education in Bowling Green, Kentucky where she also accepted Christ at the early age of eight years old. She was baptized at Friendship Baptist Church under Pastor Speights. The family later moved to North Nashville, Tennessee when she turned twelve years old where she attended North High School.

Hettie moved to Terre Haute, Indiana and later on to Indianapolis, when she was twenty three years old. When she returned to Nashville she met her mate of 40 years, Richard E. Chatman. She later moved to Loganville, Ga to care for her Mom. She joined Blessed Hope Christian Worship Center under the leadership of her brother-in law, Pastor James Byrd until he was called to Houston, Texas; and then by her nephew, Pastor Jamal Byrd, until God called her home.
